## Stoney Nakoda FN - Cooks with Stones Program

Weyerhaeuser donated \$5,000 in 2022 to the Stoney Nakoda - Cooks with Stones Program. This was the second year for the Cooks with Sones program that sees Stoney Nakoda youth spend 4 weeks learning traditional knowledge and skills at a camp held at Kootenay Plains, as well as other literacy and essential skills that can lead to jobs in the culinary and hospitality industry. The youth then spend 4 weeks in an internship placement with Pursuit – Banff/ Jasper Collection. The Cooks with Stones program was also just recognized with a national literacy award. Weyerhaeuser also supported this program in 2021 and while it is focused on the culinary and tourism industry, the community wishes to expand this initiative into the forest industry in the coming years. Jeff Struth is the Pembina representative with the Stoney Nakoda and was recognized at the graduation ceremony with an eagle feather for his support of the community. Over the last several years Jeff has supported the community through firewood, tipi poles, and pipe ceremony participation.

## September 30th - National Day for Truth and Reconciliation

#### **Edson Friendship Center Memorial Wake**

Pembina Timberlands staff participated in the Memorial Wake and Reconciliation Event hosted by the Edson Friendship Center. The event kicked off at 11:00 am with the lighting of the memorial fire followed by a Smudging ceremony to clean the air around us so that we can slow down, clear our minds, be mindful and centered. A community Elder lead us in prayer, both in English and then a more personal prayer in Cree. Through traditional drumming and signing we celebrated the sun, the children taken from their families to attend the "Residential Schools" and paid our respects to those children who did not make it home. The last drum and song was a celebration of life and good things to come and we were asked to join hands and participate in a round dance. Events were followed by a community lunch, to "break bread" together and get to know each other by exchanging stories! It was well attended with members of the community, Indigenous and otherwise, with town dignitaries and representatives from the local Provincial Government office.





#### **Round Dance - Drayton Valley Omniplex**

Pembina Timberlands staff participated in a Round Dance hosted by the Metis Nation of Alberta at the Drayton Valley Omniplex. Over 500 people attended the event. There was a feast, pipe ceremony, round dance, and drumming. Emcee's from the Stoney Nakoda Nation spoke to the journey of reconciliation and the legacy of children in the Residential Schools. Town of DV Mayor - Nancy Dodds, and Brazeau County Reeve - Bart Guyon both spoke to the importance of reconciliation and relationship building with Indigenous peoples in Alberta.

DM of Indigenous Relations – Donovan Young, spoke to the path towards reconciliation that we face and the work left to do. Finally, JP Gladu – Founder of Mokwateh Consultancy, offered insights on how best to engage with Indigenous peoples in meaningful ways. It was an excellent morning attended by Weyerhaueser Timberlands and Wood Products staff from Edson, Drayton Valley, Grande Prairie, and Edmonton. (Yes that is Fred Dzida in the center of the photo.)
